

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INTRODUCTION



FIRST STEPS:

- 1. Spend time praying about the steps you need to take to create an authentic culture of evangelism in your church. Pray your church will develop a passion for bringing the lost to Christ.
- 2. Identify one or more people in your church to join you on this journey.
- 3. Have a pen and paper handy to make notes.
- 4. Access and watch the *Introduction* video at NAMBevangelism.com.
- 5. After watching the Introduction video, continue to the next page in this guide.


THE PRIORITY OF EVANGELISM AND THE GREAT COMMISSION

Most Christians are familiar with Matthew 28:18-20. They know the vital place evangelism should occupy in their lives. But the fact remains that most believers are not involved in personal evangelism.

- Are you actively engaged in evangelism?
- Is there a group of people in your church who have a passion for personal evangelism?

Building a culture of evangelism requires a four-phased approach: **Examine, Embrace, Engage and Encourage**.

Videos to support each of these phases can be accessed online at NAMBevangelism.com. Note that these are not "one and done" steps. To be effective, all four must be nurtured on a continual basis.



EXAMINE

The Examine phase prompts you to assess your spiritual health and well-being and the level of evangelistic engagement in your church.

EMBRACE

The Embrace phase gets to the heart of developing a culture of evangelism. You will be led to explore and understand your community and develop a thorough plan for preparing your church for evangelistic engagement.

ENGAGE

The Engage phase focuses on walking through the key elements for helping your church family consistently and confidently engage in sharing the gospel.

ENCOURAGE

The Encourage phase focuses on celebrating gospel conversations and those who come to saving faith in Jesus. Having an attitude of celebration and providing tangible ways to do that are critical for building an evangelistic culture.

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EXAMINE

Access and watch the video titled *Examine: Personal Assessment* at NAMBevangelism.com

In this first phase of creating a culture of evangelism, you will examine your personal life and the life of your church as a whole in order to assess where you are now.

After watching the video segment, you will be ready to take the Personal Assessment which starts on the next page.

EVANGELISM TRAINING PERSONAL ASSESSMENT

This assessment is a tool designed to help you gauge the health of your soul, family and church. It is not exhaustive or meant to be a scientific assessment; rather it is a way for you to reflect on the condition and balance of your life and work. As you read through the following statements, evaluate how you see your present reality in each area. Remember, this is not an evaluation of how you want these areas to be in your life; it is an evaluation of how they are presently.

Rate each area from 0-10 by writing the number in the blank space — 10 meaning you "strongly agree" and 0 meaning you "strongly disagree."

Add up your scores in each section to see the results of your self-assessment.

SOUL

 I feel mentally sharp and focused most days.
 I am energized by my call to ministry and rarely struggle with my purpose in life.
 I am constantly encouraged by the companionship of the Holy Spirit, and I am ever aware of His presence in my life.
 I am sustained and strengthened by my daily time in prayer and Bible study with the Lord.
 Mentally, emotionally and spiritually, I feel strong and equipped for daily tasks and challenges.
 I rarely become critical and weighed down by the cares of this life.
 I don't feel overwhelmed by worry, anxiety or fear.
 I have a couple of close friends with whom I meet with regularly, and I can be transparent with, accountable to and encouraged by them.
 While I recognize the presence of temptations, I do not give in to them hoping to find relief from the stresses of life.
 I generally have a settled soul without the presence of restlessness.



EMBRACE

You may have explored your community demographics and have a healthy plan for reaching your neighbors. But, in an ever-changing world, it is always a good idea to stay current with changes that are happening around you. As you watch the three *Embrace* videos (*Your Community, A Plan, The Challenge*), we'll help you tackle the difficult issues related to understanding your community, your church and developing a thorough plan for preparing your church for evangelistic engagement.

As you work through the video content, prepare to take notes. Ask yourself these questions:

- What is your next step in securing and evaluating a current demographic study? (Visit namb.net/ demographics for a free report. 1 free per church every 2 years.)
- What do you need to do to review or create your church's mission and vision statements?
- What training method(s) works best for your church's context?
- What tools (review the Resource Catalog inside this kit for ideas) can you use singularly or together to help you create a training plan?
- Given your church's current situation (Startup, Turnaround, Realignment, Evangelistically Successful), what your next steps to implement an effective evangelism plan?

Do you have a plan for equipping your church members in how to start gospel conversations and how to invite people to trust in Jesus for salvation? This is the focus of the Engage phase. The As You Go/Prayer key chain inside the kit will be a tangible reminder of these critical elements in personal evangelism.

As you watch the three **Engage** videos (**Perspective and Prayer**, **Practice**, and **Preaching and Persistence**), you will learn practical ways to involve your entire church in praying for the lost and sharing the gospel with your community.

As you work through the video content, prepare to take notes. Ask yourself these questions:

- How is your church engaged in praying for those who do not know Jesus?
- Which conversation starters resonate with you? What others can you add to help your church members?
- How can you help your church members recognize opportunities for personal evangelism, encouraging them to share the gospel "As You Go"?
- How are you equipping yourself and your church to continue the conversations they start?

ENCOURAGE

The goal of the Encourage phase is to instill courage into the people in your church as they share the gospel in their community and within their spheres of influence. The three videos for **Encourage** will explore the why, the how and the where of encouragement in the following ways: **Encouraging Intentionally, Encouraging Strategically** and **Encouraging Visibly**.

The 12 Encouragement Cards in this kit (to be placed in the wood stand provided) are designed to encourage you to evangelize (2 Tim 4:5) and celebrate personal evangelism in your church. Place these cards where you can see and review them often. Rotate the cards periodically, perhaps once a month. Add to the set by creating your own! Specific ideas are included on one side of each card with the other side sharing Scripture text, a reflection or prayer prompt.

As you watch the *Encourage* videos, prepare to take notes. Ask yourself these questions:

- Who can you publically celebrate for their evangelism efforts to encourage others?
- How can you intentionally, strategically and visibly celebrate evangelism efforts?
- What are some new ideas you gleaned from the videos and Encouragement Cards on ways to celebrate personal evangelism?

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CLOSING

Watch the video titled *Closing*.

The hope is that you are excited to create a culture of evangelism in your church (and your own life!). Creating this culture isn't a "one and done" type of campaign. The four Es of **Examine, Embrace, Engage** and **Encourage** need to be practiced continually.

Remember — you are not alone. God empowers His church, and He will strengthen you and your people for the task He has given you.

You also have friends at the North American Mission Board, your local Baptist association and your regional or state Baptist convention who stand ready to help. We look forward to celebrating as churches create a culture of evangelism and more people come to know Jesus!


